This position leads the Yale EHS Environmental Affairs Section, including permitting, reporting, recordkeeping and hazardous waste management. The position directly supervises four employees, including an environmental operations manager who supervises eight employees. Yale has over 50 environmental permits, licenses and registrations, and annually manages over 800 tons of radioactive, biomedical, universal and other hazardous waste. This position works closely with other EHS employees who perform inspections and are responsible for safety compliance at our power plants and construction sites. Our Environmental Affairs Manager must provide excellent customer service and establish positive working relationships with regulatory agencies.
