The University of Connecticut Office of the Vice President for Research and Graduate Education is seeking a Program Specialist I to function as an Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) Coordinator. This individual will report to the Associate Director of the Office of Research Compliance (ORC)/IACUC and will work closely with other research compliance staff members, the Office of Animal Research Services (OARS) and members of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) to ensure that all animal care and use activities related to research and/or teaching conform to all applicable University, State, Federal and other external regulatory requirements and guidelines.

Responsibilities include participation in routine compliance activities, including the preliminary review of animal use protocols and participation in animal facility inspections and reviews of the animal care and use program. This individual will prepare manuals and SOPs detailing the operation of the IACUC and the IACUC office, prepare materials for the IACUC website and assist in preparing and presenting training programs for IACUC members, researchers and new staff. The successful candidate will maintain current knowledge on federal, state, local and other animal use regulations, guidelines, and policies and ensure that changes are integrated into existing procedures, policies and SOPs. This person will participate in the internal auditing of animal use activities, prepare reports of non-compliance, document corrective actions and follow-up and serve as an expert resource for investigators on regulations, policies and guidelines governing animal care and use.

Minimum Qualifications: Bachelor's degree in the biological sciences or related field and two to five years of professional experience with research compliance requiring knowledge and understanding of applicable regulations (or equivalent combination of education and experience); ability to use independent judgment to interpret, analyze and apply federal and university guidelines to promote compliant practices; proficiency with Microsoft Office; good writing skills and excellent organization skills; experience creating training materials and ability to present information to individuals or groups; ability to multitask and trouble-shoot problems; ability to work with minimal supervision and exercise a high level of independence and discretion.

Preferred Qualifications: Knowledge of federal laws, regulations and procedures pertaining to the care and use of animals used for research and teaching as described in the Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals, the Guide for the Care and Use of Animals in Agricultural Research and Teaching, the USDA Animal Welfare Act and the Public Health Service Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals is preferred. Experience using animals in a research setting and a demonstrated understanding of scientific methodology is a plus. Ability to collegially interact with others to provide guidance and assistance in meeting regulatory requirements and resolving problems is desirable.

Chemical Technician: Assembles, fabricates, tests, modifies, services and repairs experimental apparatus. Operates machine shop equipment, handles compressed gases and cryogenics. Oversees the integrity of building temperature control and fume exhaust systems. Performs a variety of minor electrical, plumbing, and carpentry repair duties. Follows preventative maintenance programs for motors, laboratory equipment, vacuum systems, cryogenic systems, electrical and electronic equipment and computers. Trains and supervises student workers.

Department Chemical Hygiene Officer: Assists the College's Chemical Hygiene office with plan compliance. Maintains MSDS files and equipment in compliance with local, state, and federal regulations. Oversees general chemical safety aspects of chemical inventory storage, handling and waste disposal, oversees cleanup of chemical spills. Assists with safety training of student research and teaching assistants.

The successful candidate must understand and execute a variety of operations/tasks, and be able to work independently, solving problems with minimal supervisor intervention.
